Saint of the Week

July 5— Athanasius founded monastic life on Mount Athos in 958, where he organized the hermits and little sketes into what we call today the Great Lavra. Three other monasteries were begun by him, all still flourishing. The hermits resented his intrusion and bringing more organization into their lives, but they came to see his holiness and wisdom, and at his death in 1003 acclaimed him as a saint. This peninsula is still called the Holy Mountain and has been the home of monks in monasteries or little hermitages for many centuries.

Independence Day - We are blessed to live in the freest nation on the planet. Founded in 1776 when the 13 Colonies broke from Great Britain, the United States continues to evolve with new immigrants, and new social challenges. There were 25,000 Catholics in those colonies, living under restrictive laws in Maryland and New Jersey, and relative freedom in Pennsylvania. They were Africans, English, French, German, Irish, and Scots, served by 25 priests who lived on horseback.

General Washington overcame the British anti-Catholic prejudices by having Catholics as his guards, banning hostile actions against Catholics, and writing a formal letter to the Catholics in 1790 in which he wrote:

may the members of your society in America, animated alone by the pure spirit of Christianity, and still conducting themselves as the faithful subjects of our free government, enjoy every temporal and spiritual felicity.

Catholic France and Spain recognized the republic and supplied weapons and troops. Catholic military leaders came from France, Poland, and German states; two Catholics helped frame the Constitution. The United States emerged as the first nation granting full freedom of religion to all believers. We remain the freest nation on the planet - may our Church, in all its forms, continue to flourish in America, and may we continue to be a light to the nations.
