## Bl. Theodore Romzha

The first bishop-martyr of the Byzantine Catholic Church was murdered on Oct. 31, 1947, after having survived a brutal attack by Soviet secret police a few days earlier. This martyr began life in an ordinary working class family, but was inspired to seek not only the priesthood, but the life of a secret missionary in the Soviet Union.

Born in 1911 in Austria-Hungary, he entered the seminary in Rome in 1930. He was ordained a priest in 1938 and returned home, now in the Republic of Czechoslovakia, which was caught up in Hitler's plans for World War II. In 1939 he became a teacher and spiritual director at our seminary for the eparchy of Mukachevo, which was headquartered in Uzhhorod. In 1943 the bishop suddenly died, and to everyone's surprise, the 33-year-old Father Romzha was named the new bishop.

In October, 1944, the Red Army "liberated" the territory of the eparchy and began immediate persecution of our Church. In 1945, the entire province was annexed to the Soviet Union. "To Die For Christ Is To Live Forever" was the bishop's slogan as he preached in every town and led the resistance to atheism and being forced into the Russian Orthodox Church, which was collaborating with Stalin in destroying our Church.

In 1949 our Church was declared dissolved and driven into an underground existence for fifty years. Father Artur was one of the first students at the Bl. Theodore Romzha seminary in Uzhhorod. Many people in our parish have had favors granted after praying to our martyr. May he always inspire us in faith and loyalty to Christ's Church.

**Catholicism and Halloween**: The word "Halloween" is an abbreviation from Old English: All Hallows E'en, the last word meaning evening. It is of course on the vigil of All Saints Day, and the day after that on the Latin calendar is All Souls.

In Europe there developed a tradition of baking "soul cakes" in honor of the faithful departed. These cakes were baked on All Hallows' Eve and children would go out begging door-to-door for these cakes in exchange for praying for deceased relatives and friends. It is believed that in some places there was a tradition of wearing disguises while "souling" that represented the various souls in purgatory who were seeking these prayers. And of course, the processional candles were carried sheltered from the wind in hollowed-out gourds or turnips, called Jack O'Lanterns.

Unfortunately, the religious origins have been replaced with gruesome costumes and references to evil forces, none of which were part of the original festivities. If your children are going out trick-or-treating or to a party, why don't you have them dress as a favorite saint or blessed (if a martyr, then without the bloody gore!) and thus reclaim the day for your family?
