Saint Jude, Apostle, Relative of the Lord, and Wonderworker

Jude Thaddeus is part of the extended family of Jesus, and is usually depicted holding a medallion of the Holy Face of Christ. This is based on the tradition that the miraculous image of Jesus not-made-with-hands, the Mandylion, was preserved in the city of Edessa, which was Jude's base for part of his apostolic preaching. He is also shown with a club or a halberd, with which he was martyred; a scroll, for his Letter which is included in the New Testament; and with a flame on his head, referring to his Letter 1:22-23. He is associated with St. Simon the Zealot, and was martyred with him, and thus a host of churches are known as SS. Simon and Jude across the Christian world.

Jude's feast is kept on June 19 in the East, and October 28 in the West. His service in Greater Armenia (eastern Turkey today), Edessa, and Mesopotamia resulted in his popularity in Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, Iran and India, while the export of his relics to the West and an alleged letter of Jesus to King Abgar of Edessa and the resultant miracles of healing rooted him among the Slavs, Germans, Celts, and French well before the Middle Ages.

He is known as the saint of the desperate, the saint to whom one can always turn to for help. Because of the similarity of his name to that of the traitor Judas, he is known by his second name as well, which can lead to confusion when trying to keep track of him as there is a St. Thaddeus of the Seventy Disciples of Christ! Once unknown in the US, devotion to him was introduced in 1929 in Chicago at what has become the National Shrine of St. Jude. Thousands successfully turned to his intercession in the Great Depression, and the many medical cures resulted in comedian Danny Thomas (a Maronite Catholic from Lebanon) founding St. Jude Children's Hospital in Memphis.

Today St. Jude is one of the most popular heavenly intercessors in North America (Canada, US, Mexico).

Father Chris loans his first-class relic of St. Jude to the parish every year for use in the church during the bazaar and the Sunday after. Armenian Dominicans were entrusted with part of his body, but the push of Islam drove them to Italy, and Father's relic comes from what was entrusted to the papacy in Rome.

PRAYER TO ST. JUDE

We praise you, O Jude, faithful witness, relative of Christ the Lord, an unshakeable pillar of the Church. You preached the Word to the Gentile nations, and you have been exalted in return by God, Who grants you the grace of healing. You are the intercessor of those who turn to you, healing their ills and consoling their sorrows. Glorious apostle and martyr St. Jude, hear the prayer now of those who turn to you, so that through your intercession we can receive remission of our sins and strength to carry our burdens. Amen
